The former Lake Louise Community Center, the "Clubhouse", was a 2,778 square foot building originally built in 1942 with an addition constructed in 1955. Possible renovations were studied but NC Building Code and ADA compliance issues made them unfeasible. In August 2017 Town Council voted unanimously to designate the \$550,000 proceeds from the Eller Cove Watershed Conservation Easement for the construction of a new community center and the Clubhouse was demolished in December 2017. The project includes the replacement of the Clubhouse with a state-of-the-art 6,645 square foot community center that is in keeping with the natural beauty of Lake Louise Park.
